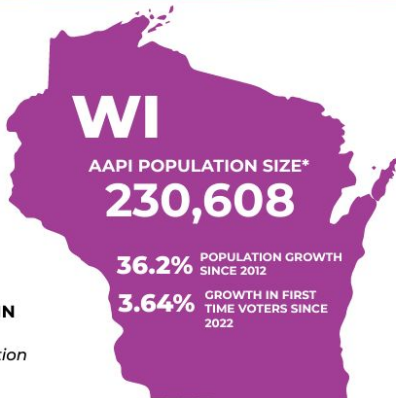



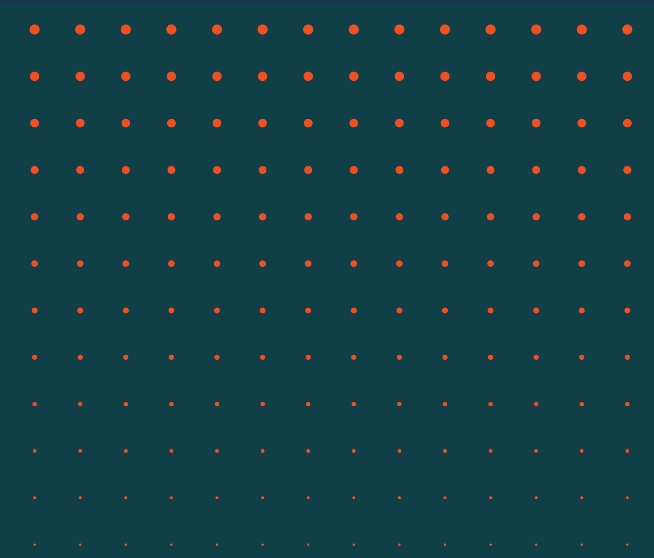

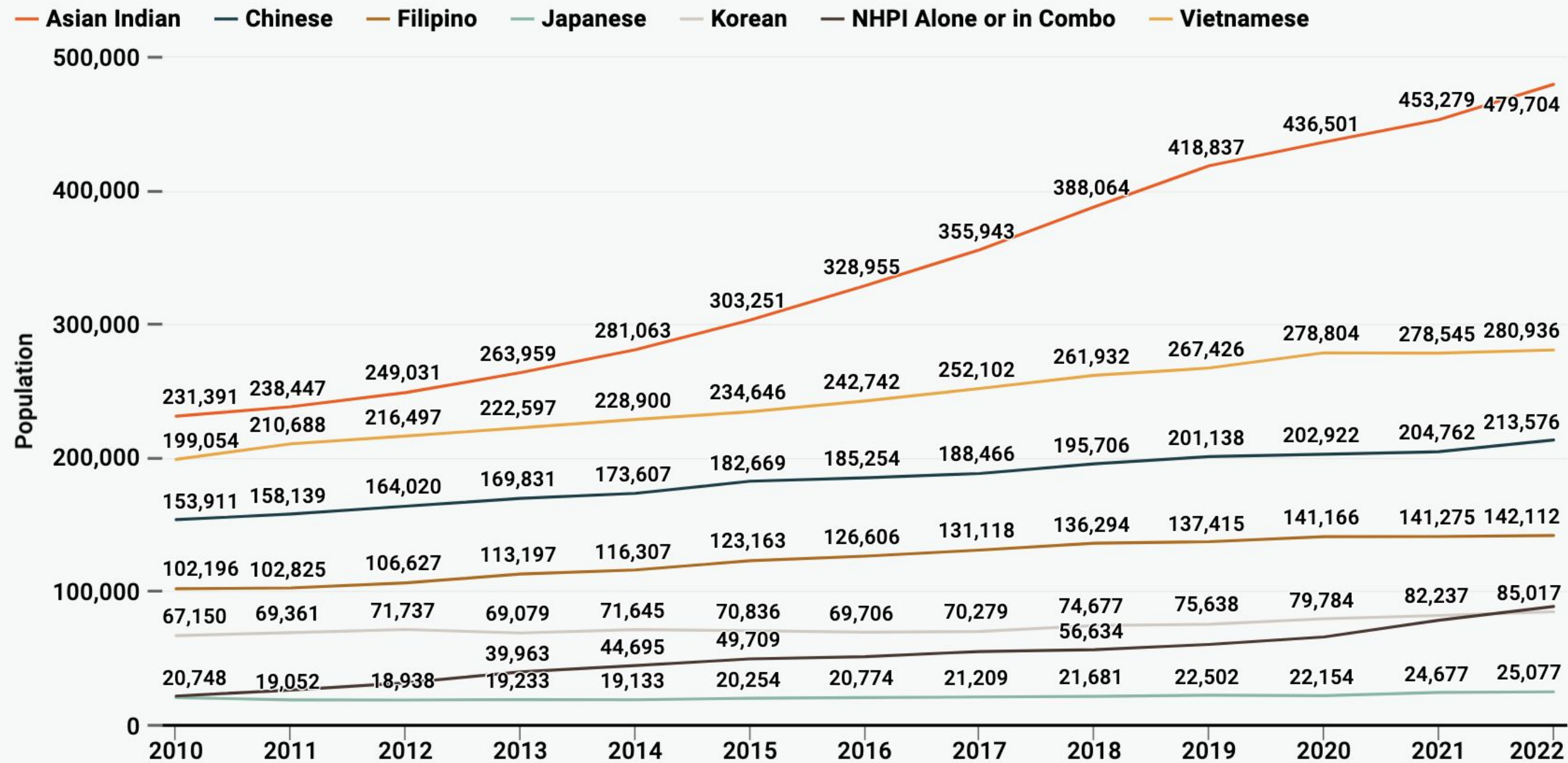

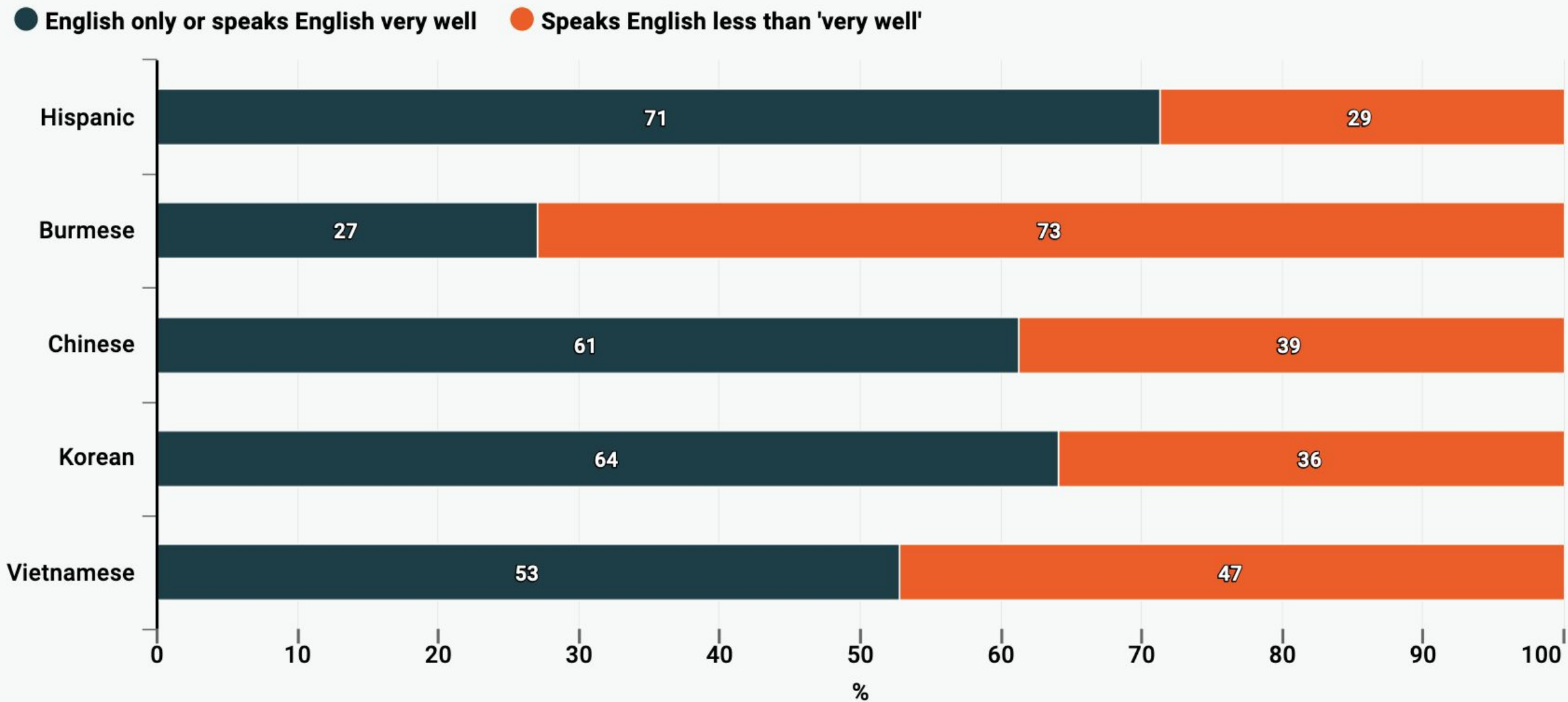

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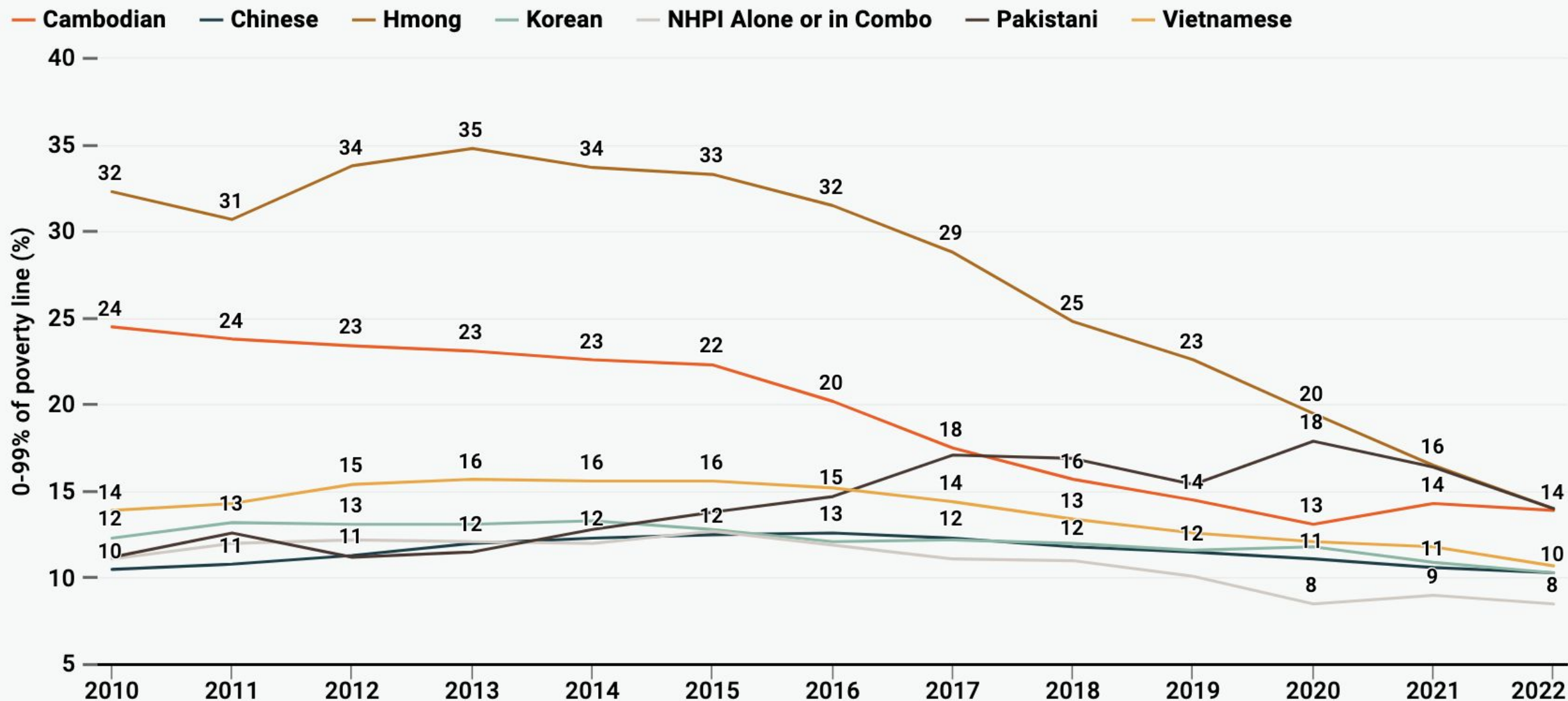

Poverty in California

Estimated share of residents who live at different levels of the Federal Poverty Line (FPL). Whether an individual falls below the official "poverty line" depends not only on total family income, but also on the size of the family, the number of people in the family who are children, and the age of the householder (under/over age 65).

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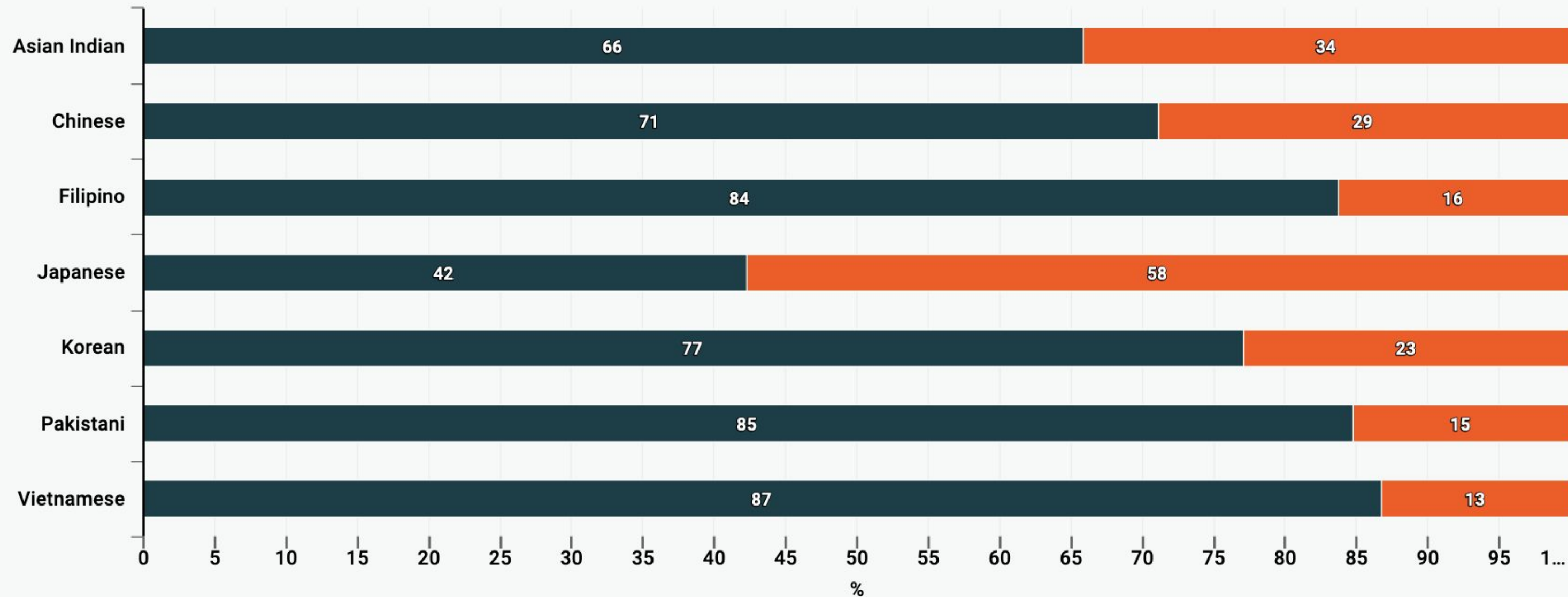
